Our Formation House Moves South

How many vans does it take to move a Formation House one thousand and ninety-nine miles south?

Three vans, plus a U-Haul!

When it comes to how many hands, the answer is a lot more than three! Our Formation House, consisting of Postulants, Novices, and Formators, is now living at our convent in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Soon, the Formation Sisters will move into their new home, set apart for those in Initial Formation — the eagerly awaited Novitiate House also located at the Cypress Springs Mercedarian Prayer Center (see more on page 3).

Preparing the Way

Unlike John the Baptist, no locusts, honey, or camel hair were involved before Mother Jeanette Marie.

HMSS, our Formator, and eight novices made the move from Cleveland, Ohio to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, but a U-Haul was sent ahead thanks to the generosity of the family of Sr. Joseph Marie, HMSS! After a couple weeks of packing, the U-Haul was loaded up with the help of two seminarians from the Diocese of Cleveland, Nathan Frankart and Cameron Ferrell. Then, Sr. Joseph Marie and her family hit the road. What went with them? What you typically find in a convent: habits, veils, art supplies, board games, a whole library, an exercise bike, and more!

First Arrivals

Our Sisters already in Baton Rouge and the local community did much to prepare for the arrival of our Sisters in Formation.

As the U-Haul arrived, students

from St. Michael the Archangel High School were ready to help with the unloading of the boxes. This first arrival, while necessary, pales in comparison with the second: the arrival of Elizabeth, Olivia, and Kristin, who entered our community as Postulants on September 23rd (see more on page 6). As the first young women to enter Postulancy in Baton Rouge, this marks an important moment in our Region's history!

The Caravan

They came not by plane, boat, camel, or train... in early October, our eight novices and Mother Jeanette Marie, accompanied by the seven Professed Sisters in our Cleveland community, took on a two-day caravan by minivan. It takes a lot of prayer, laughter, and snacks to make a thousand mile journey, especially after the beautiful and thoughtful send-offs from our friends in Cleveland. Early in the night, on October 11th, the caravan reached the convent located on the grounds of the Cypress Springs Mercedarian Prayer Center property in East Baton Rouge.

A New Era

We have the great blessing of not only building a Novitiate House, but seeing the progress with our own



eyes, and hope to make one last move into the new Novitiate House in early Spring 2024.

What is this new era like so far?

It is one of new experiences and exploration. The beautiful people of Baton Rouge have certainly brought it to a great start with their generosity and hospitality. For many of our Sisters in Initial Formation, there have been many firsts: first jambalayas and gumbos, first experiences of the South, first "warm" winter. The natural surroundings are hard to beat; with scenic trails, ponds, and wildlife. the environment itself lends well to prayer. The Chapel of Divine Providence is a beautiful place of worship and provides ample room for our Sisters. Best of all, in this home, there is space to grow, to invite others to come and encounter the Lord, and to invite young women to follow Him in building the Eucharistic Kingdom!





Entrance to Postulancy



On September 23, 2023, during the First Vespers of the Solemnity of Our Lady of Ransom, our Institute admitted Kristin Foresman, Elizabeth Jasek, and Olivia Staverman into Postulancy. This marked the first time young women entered with us in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, at our Chapel of Divine Providence. "Postulancy...aims at deepening the individual's

"Postulancy...aims at deepening the individual's human and Christian experience in order that she achieve greater maturity in her vocational choice for the Institute" (Constitutions #106).

In the ceremony, our Regional Superior, Mother Mary Rosario Vega-R., HMSS, on behalf of the Community, received Kristin, Elizabeth, and Olivia and invited them to share in the life of the Institute so that they may better know the spirituality, charism, lifestyle, and apostolate of the Mercedarian Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament.

Bishop Michael G. Duca of Baton Rouge presided over the ceremony and was joined by Fr. Joshua Johnson, Vocations Director for the Diocese and pastor of Sacred Heart of Jesus Catholic Church. Within the ceremony, Bishop Duca presented to each Postulant a medal containing images of the Eucharist in a monstrance and Our Lady of Mercy, the scapular of Our Lady of Mercy, a rosary, and a chapel veil. The Sisters, fellow LEM members, and those present received the Postulants with great joy in a reception following the ceremony. In the morning of August 22, 2023, *The Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary*, at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Cleveland, Ohio, our Postulant Class of 2022 entered Novitiate. The Entrance Ceremony took place during Lauds (Morning Prayer) with Fr. Kevin Fox as the presider. From there, we began a two-year journey of prayer, study, and further discernment of our vocation within the Mercedarian religious family. The first of the two years of Novitiate is the canonical year, "which, in order to be valid, must last twelve months passed in the novitiate community" (Constitutions #112). This means we do not participate in works or events related to the Community's apostolate, nor do we visit our families during the summer as is typical each year.

In this "cloistered" year, we enter into an experience of the hidden life of the Holy Family in the home at Nazareth – the silent time during which the Child Jesus grew up, prayed, and worked with Mary and Joseph, learned from them, "and was obedient to them" (Lk 2:51b), until the beginning of His public life and ministry. Remaining in Community with our Sisters for this year, in this home and this holy family into which God has brought us, we seek even greater union with Him in prayer, in our studies, and in loving and serving Him in our Sisters. We seek to grow ever more conformed to Him, and ever more in love with Christ as our Bridegroom.





Every morning now, when we put on our veils - the veils that signify our consecration to Him and the hidden life that we live with Him, in Him, and for Him - we pray, "Sweet Jesus, by this veil I am consecrated to You. May it conceal me from creatures, and that I may always be for you a pure, holy, and immaculate tabernacle."

Please pray for Sisters Beatriz Galindo, Amanda Hartwell, Megan Henle, Katie Krantz, and myself as we begin this journey of Novitiate in our Institute, that as Jesus has taken us into His home, we ourselves may become more and more a holy and loving home for Him.
